Our organizational mission is to prevent disease and injury, promote positive health outcomes and provide critical health services to improve the health status of the community. We are comprised of five service areas to meet the needs of the communities that we service.

Administration Services: We set policies, plan programs, and handle the fiscal, legal and human resource functions of the agency. Administration sets priorities and performance goals for the other four areas that provide services to the community.

Community Health Services: We provide several programs that promote better health and prevent chronic disease. Safety and nutrition programs are offered as part of the overall plan to provide health care to the communities served.

Environmental Health Services: We work to identify, prevent or eliminate diseases that are spread in water, food, wastes or by animals and insects.

Epidemiology & Surveillance Services (E&S): We track the spread of diseases that are passed from person to person. Chronic disease rates are also monitored. Diseases that are spread by food or water are investigated. E&S also works with communities to develop emergency preparedness plans.

Nursing Services: We collaborate with individuals, families and communities to identify, plan and deliver public health nursing programs that include immunizations, lead screening, home visiting, and school health.

Nursing

Preventive Health Services:

Blood pressure screenings for seniors, Immunizations and flu clinics, Immunization Action Plan for physician offices, Lead screening and education, Office based physician immunization education, Perinatal outreach, and Travel clinic

School Health Services:

Disease prevention and control, Health curriculum and policy development, Health education to students and staff, Health screenings, Coordinated School Health, and Immunization record review

Family Health Services:

BCMh public health nursing services, Help Me Grow home visiting services, and Service coordination for premature infants

Child Care Services:

Health education, Fatherhood programs, Resource and referral to center based and home child care providers, and Technical assistance by nurses for child care providers who serve children with special health care needs

Health Education:

Asthma, Blood borne pathogens, CPR, Care of the premature infant, Child abuse and neglect, Communicable disease, Daddy 911, First aid, Maturation, Medication administration, Shaken baby syndrome, and SIDS
