

Healthcare Provider Lead Poisoning Prevention Program

The goal of the program is to increase lead testing for children at-risk of lead poisoning

Children at-risk of lead poisoning are often missed.

- Cuyahoga County children represented 46% of all lead poisoning cases in Ohio in 2010.
- Approximately 1000 children tested had lead levels of 10 μg/dL or greater.
- Research has found evidence of permanent damage at lower lead levels. More than 25% of Cleveland children and 19% of children throughout Cuyahoga County have levels greater than 5 μg/dL.
- Only half the number of children on Medicaid in Cuyahoga County are tested for lead at ages 1 and 2.
