

## Alternatives to Hazardous Household Products

Cleaning Product	Alternative Cleaning Product
Air Freshener	Simmer water with herbs or spices; or use baking soda in a dish to absorb odors.
All-purpose Cleaner	Mix1/4 cup of ammonia, 1/4 cup of vinegar, 2/3 cup of baking soda, and 1 gallon of warm water.
Carpet & Rug Cleaner	Sprinkle cornmeal on DRY carpets to absorb dirt and grease. Wait 5 minutes and vacuum thoroughly. For stains, mix 1 cup liquid soap with 1/3 cup warm water, and whip into a foam and apply. Wipe clean with cloth and warm water.
Drain Cleaner	Pour 1 cup of baking soda down the drain. Follow that with 1 cup of white vinegar. Let stand for 15 minutes, then flush with boiling water.
Fabric Softener	Pour 1/4 cup white vinegar into the final rinse cycle.
Floor Stripper (for removal of old wax)	Pour a small amount of club soda on a section of the floor. Scrub well, let soak for a few minutes, and then wipe clean.
Floor Wax	Mix 1 part thick boiled starch with 1 part liquid soap. Rub the mixture on the floor and polish dry with a soft clean cloth.
Furniture Polish	<ul><li>For wood that has been stained but not varnished or painted: Use olive oil on a cloth to polish.</li><li>For wood that has been varnished or painted: Mix 2 tbsp olive oil with 1 tbsp white vinegar and 1 liter water in a spray bottle. Spray the furniture lightly and dry with a cloth.</li></ul>
Glass & Mirror Cleaner	Mix in a spray bottle 1 qt. water and 2 tsp. white vinegar. Spray on and dry with a rag or crumpled up newspaper.
Household Insecticide	Sprinkle red pepper, chili pepper or paprika wherever insects enter the house.
Metal Polish/ Cleaner	<ul> <li><i>Aluminum</i> - Boil 1 qt. of water and 2 tbsp. of cram of tartar; immerse product and simmer for 10 min.</li> <li><i>Brass, bronze, chrome</i> - Dissolve 1 tsp. of salt in 1 cup of white vinegar, and add enough flour to make a stiff paste. Apply the paste to metal and let stand for 30 min. Rinse with warm water, and buff.</li> <li><i>Copper</i> - Mix table salt with enough lemon juice to make it wet, and rub on product with a soft clean cloth.</li> <li><i>Silver</i> - Place a sheet of aluminum foil into a plastic bowl. Sprinkle the foil with 1 tsp. table salt and 1 tsp. baking soda, and fill bowl with warm water. Soak your silver in the bowl, and then dry and buff with soft clean cloth.</li> </ul>

Mothballs	Use cedar chips or dried lavender in the drawer or closet.
Oven Cleaner	Combine equal parts of baking soda and salt, and mix this with enough water to form a paste. Use a steel wool scrubbing pad to apply the paste. Avoid wires and heating elements.
Shoe Polish	Use olive oil or beeswax with a cloth and then buff.
Spot Removers	Club soda for fruit juice; lemon juice for ink and sweat; baking soda for urine; cold water for blood; mix corn meal and water, and soak for general spots.
Tub & Tile Cleaner	Mix 1/4 cup baking soda, 1 cup white vinegar, 1 cup ammonia into 1 gallon of warm water. Then apply with a sponge.
Toilet Bowl Cleaner	Scrub the bowl with baking soda and a mild soap, then pour 1/4 cup bleach into bowl and scrub; let sit for 15 min. and flush.
