- Two full-time attorneys, one paralegal

 - Shannon Slimak Paralegal
- All services are offered free of charge to clients*
- Sole Ryan White-funded legal services provider in Cleveland TGA
 - All HIV+ clients in six-county area, in or out of care, are eligible for services

CLIENTS SERVED IN THE PREVIOUS GRANT YEAR

- 234 unique clients (static in prior grant year)
- 9,022 hours billed (+14.5% from previous grant year)


 Stable housing is a critical foundation for client success in managing their disease
