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2017 Teen Birth Rates by Municipality and Race

In 2017, 836 babies were born to Cuyahoga County females who were 15 to 19 years old for a rate of 21.5^{1,2} per 1,000 females in this age group (**Table 1**). This rate was slightly lower than the 2016 rate of 21.8^{3,4}. The 2017 county rate was higher than the U.S. (18.8)⁵ and the state of Ohio (20.8)⁵.

Key Findings

- There were 28 fewer teen births in 2017 compared to 2016^{1,3}.
- The black teen birth rate (41.4)^{1,2} was nearly four times as high as the white teen birth rate (10.5)^{1,2}.
- Highest rates of teen births for municipalities with at least 50 females age 15 to 19 years:
 - 1) East Cleveland
 - 2) Warrensville Heights
 - 3) Cleveland
 - 4) Maple Heights
 - 5) Garfield Heights

Definitions

- A. Teen birth rate: $\frac{\text{Number of births to Moms aged 15 to 19 years old}}{\text{Number of females aged 15 to 19 year old}} \times 1000$

Technical Notes

- A. 'Suppress' means the rate cannot be shared per the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Disclosure Limitation Standard if the denominator (number of females in municipality) minus the numerator (number of teen births) is less than 10.
- B. Municipality has less than 100 females 15 to 19 years old as well as for each race group, which can lead to unstable rates. Please use rate with caution.
- C. Black-White inequity rate is only calculated if both the black and white female population for 15 to 19 years old has at least 50 females.
- D. The '∞' symbol means the white rate = 0.0 and it is not possible to divide by 0.
- E. Descending rank order was used; a rank of '1' means the municipality has the highest teen birth rank in that category.
- F. Ranking teen birth data occurred if at least 50 females 15 to 19 years old as well as for each race group.
