## Health Care Provider/First Responder Workflow: Lab-Confirmed Case V.2 Updated 3/30/20

- 1. CCBH notified of case, conducts case interview and contact tracing discussion and sends order of isolation
- 2. CCBH notifies Infection Control Practitioner at place of employment
  - Employer follows/manages contacts also employed at same facility/organization (employees, learners) if resources available
    - i. If organization requests, CCBH can follow/manage employee contacts
  - Organization provides CCBH with list of patient contacts and CCBH performs contact interview and sends quarantine order/information to all contacts
- 3. CCBH encourages HCP to contact own PCP to assist with symptom management and triage of clinical stability during course of illness. Case provided with CCBH 24/7 MD line as another point of contact.
- 4. CCBH encourages HCP to call Occupational Medicine Department where they work for further guidance on return to work

## Health Care Provider/First Responder Workflow: Exposed/Identified Contact V.2 Updated 3/30/20

- 1. CCBH calls contact to assess exposure and symptoms
  - If symptomatic then refer to above workflow for positive case (HCP is classified as a presumptive case symptomatic case with epidemiologic link to lab-confirmed case)
    - Testing will be conducted at discretion of employer and symptomatic HCP will be instructed to contact employer about testing protocol (HCPs/first responders are high priority testing category per CDC and ODH)
  - If asymptomatic, CCBH will provide guidance on exposure risk and send order of guarantine with caveat as below explained over the phone
- 2. CCBH explains CDC guidance for exposed HCP to potentially continue working
  - HCP can continue patient care if asymptomatic
  - Encourage HCP to discuss expectations for reporting to work with their supervisor
  - Employer should have protocol in place to check temperatures before beginning shift and to assess if symptoms are present.
