New Business

Discuss Consumer Feedback from Oral Health Survey

J. McMinn – This feedback will be the basis of how we decide what to come up with for oral health. If anyone has any concerns you want to identify, please write them because without that feedback we have nothing to go forward.

*Response: R. Watkins – Yes, we discussed earlier that we would wait for CLC's final report. Now the strategy is to take a look at the final results of the survey feedback and then Quality will make decisions on further guidance.

Listed below are the responses from the 59 people who took the survey.

- 1. Are you receiving dental care? For yes, it was 54%, 33.9% said no, and 11% said occasional.
- *Comment: S. Harris That may be an opportunity to look into why for the other percentages.
- 2. Rate your knowledge of RW Part A dental services. All responded, most said very familiar but I was pretty widespread in responses.
- *Comment: S. Harris -Those not familiar may be an opportunity for further effort of CLC to explore how to access the services.
- 3. How would you rate your RW Part A dental experience? From the 57 respondents, 38% was neither dissatisfied nor satisfied and the next highest at 31% was for very satisfied.

^{*}Comment: N. O'Neal - We will also be providing a report on the feedback in CLC.



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4. Do you understand how HIV affects dental hygiene? The majority at 56.9%, or 33, said yes, 11 said somewhat, and 14 said they did not.

*Comment: S. Harris — "This is also an opportunity to help educate PLWHs more on this subject."

- **5.** During your dental visits, have you been made aware of a treatment plan for care of your teeth? One person skipped, 55% said yes, and a little over 44% were not aware or not sure if they were aware. ***Comment:** S. Harris "This may be another opportunity to provide more guidance."
- **6.** Is anything you would need to make you want to go to the dentist or make your experience with the dentist better? For 12% transportation was needed, 25% was flexible hours, 29% locating a dentist, and 42% said "other." Most responded "nothing," another was early appointments, great experience, long wait, and past experience.
- **7. Where do you rank dental care on your list of importance?** Most said dental care is important to RW recipients.
- **8. What are your fears/concerns about going to the dentist?** For 39% it was pain, 11% was trauma or a bad experience, three said childhood history and the rest said "other" was their fear.
- *Question: R. Watkins What was the percentage of "others"?
- *Response: S. Harris That was 43% or 22 respondents
- 9. Have you had a negative experience seeing a dentist? Most said no, 36 yes.
- **10.** Are you aware of the grievance process or that you can file a grievance if you were not satisfied with your dental service? From the 56 respondents, 39% was yes, 44.6% no, and 16.7% somewhat. *Comment: S. Harris This is another education opportunity to make aware of the grievance process.
- 11. If you answered YES to question ten (10), have you used the grievance process to report a problem receiving dental care? Out of 59, only 49 responded. Four said yes, 36 had not used the process.
- *Comment: R. Watkins It's good to finally get to oral health and now we have actual data to process.
- *Comment: N. O'Neal Think some of the questions would have been better if they were worded better and if we had follow-up. Also, not sure some really understood them.
- *Comment: R. Watkins Now we know what we need to add because CLC did a wonderful job of putting this together.
- *Question: J. McMinn Are we satisfied with the answer for 55% outcomes being okay?
- *Response: R. Watkins Yes, but we can review this to explore further.
- *Comment: S. Harris Because more people were not aware, maybe there is an opportunity to provide education on how treatment plans are delivered and what constitutes a treatment plan.
- *Comment: Dr. Gripshover Providers should give clear dental plans. This may be a good training opportunity to inform clients on what's a treatment plan.



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*Comment: N. O'Neal – We need a standard treatment plan in place, we have never established that. Also, there are some providers that are not even doing treatment plans for RW clients and that needs to be established, as well.

Oral Health Services- Next Steps – R. Watkins

The next step is CLC will present their final feedback in the October 6th meeting and come back to QI for their recommendations.

Standing Business

Represent the TGA in Statewide Integrated Plan – R. Watkins

In the minutes, from the August 18th QI meeting, V. Panakkal provided clarity on the Needs Assessment and Statewide Integration Plan, stating they are separate but that "it's confusing because the state wants to use these feedback gatherings from both projects...for the whole TGA." R. Watkins stated that the committee should be clear on what they report and that both projects must be on point.

- **S. Harris** The needs assessment is examining the needs of people living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA) and using the information gathered to inform strategies for what goes into the statewide plan. They are still formulating what goes into the plan, but the needs assessment will provide information that supports that plan. In the past presentations to PC, they were collecting info from us on how to go forward, but we still have to offer assistance as they work to form that structure and be ready to support the needs assessment data collection effort, such as providing feedback in surveys and focus group feedback sessions.
- **V. Panakkal** There are currently no updates on the Needs Assessment. The next integrated plan discussion is set for October 7th, but there is still no official confirmation. In the past, data was collected in Columbus, now it's being done virtually.
