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## **Cuyahoga Regional HIV Prevention and Care Planning Council**

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#### **Administrative Update- Z. Levar**

- The Statewide Integrated Plan is now on a monthly schedule. In the last meeting, April 21, they discussed the progress on the nine Affinity groups. Those groups will be smaller groups that will focus on topics such as barriers to housing for PLWH and other robust discussions to help form the integrated plan as it develops. They are also in the process of determining co-chairs for those groups and should start kick off sometime in mid-May. The next meeting is May 19, 2022, from 9-11 am, via MicroSoft Teams.
- The next Part A HIV newsletter is planned for release in early June. PC submitted a piece for the newsletter coordination with CLC to promote the Consumer Survey.
- The Case Management Network met on April 19<sup>th</sup> and had a robust discussion on HIV criminalization laws and on the latest CLC consumer survey. They presented findings and CLC co-chair, Naimah O'Neal, facilitated that with her ongoing work with the Ohio modernization movement and talked about the PC consumer survey. She stated there were many people who had taken the survey, with good results.
- We received the Part A partial award and notification that full award should arrive very soon.
- The Ending the HIV Epidemic (EtHE) grant will be continuing with same set of programs, in particular, our social media campaigns where we will focus on Pride Month in June, Hispanic Heritage in August or September, and Black History month in October. We will use similar campaign strategies to focus on these populations, such as setting up tables at Pride events to provide handouts, news and other HIV and PC updates.
- \*Comment: C. Droster Glad to get back out in community, a positive thing.
- Staffing update: Zach Levar transitioned to Melissa Rodrigo's role as Deputy Director of Prevention & Wellness. CCBH's Monica Baker was promoted as the new Part A HIV Supervisor. CCBH's Gloria Agosto-Davis, was promoted to the new Ending the HIV Epidemic (EtHE) Supervisor. Both will start on 5/9/22.

#### **Fiscal Report**

#### FY2021 Part A Grant:

Final Expenditure split - 79.40% Core - 20.60% Support

Expenses are at 95.50% for 12 months (100% target)

The books are currently closed, we are tying up a few loose ends, and the split is well in the safe zone of 79/20. We also crossed the threshold and were able to reach \$4 million across the 14 categories we fund. We are happy to see this, as we spent more than last year, so we are getting back on track. We are trending low in EFA (Emergency Financial Assistance) which is a safety net, so we took some money from that category, allowing providers some flexibility. We are also lower on oral health, 80% of the total allocation for that service category.

For now, we do not recommend drastic changes in either category. We also continue working on exception requests, to approve long-term treatment plans earlier in the grant year and then monitor them throughout. We found that when we approve exceptions later in the year, clients are not able to complete their treatment plan and get the costs processed within the grant period as required. Last, there were almost 3,300 clients served with Part A funding.

\*Comment: Z. Levar – We appreciate PC allowing us to allocate those funds. We also gave the project officer our numbers and she was happy with these numbers.

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Clinton Droster - Chair

The S&F Resource Allocation workgroup met on April 28<sup>th</sup> and discussed categories most important in consumer priority and flagging items 10% up or down, impacted by utilization and spending.

\*Comment: S. Harris - We identified four categories that have a broader swing, meaning they may have had a priority ranking of 8 in the prior year, but were ranked 4 in the last year. This meant they became a higher priority and we will need to flag them for further review, as the purpose in flagging is to have a broader discussion on how these changes came about. We also looked at the number of people who accessed and used those services to discuss those changes. Last, we agreed to run numbers so, at the May 26<sup>th</sup> meeting, we can discuss the items with big swings in usage and funding.

\*Comment: C. Droster – We are also looking at FTE-based staffing dependent categories and Zach agreed to color code them, so people know they are employee-funded categories.

\*Question: C. Barnett – What is an FTE?

\*Response: C. Droster - Full time equivalent.

\*Comment: Z. Levar -We will make a summary sheet for PSRA purpose.

\*Comment: S. Harris – The main goal is to carefully determine how we make funding changes so as to not fund categories below the levels needed. If anyone is interested in joining the next meeting on Thursday, May 26<sup>th</sup>, let us know and Toni or I will send you the meeting link.
