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### Administrative Update- Z. Levar

- The Integrated Plan have formed Affinity groups. They kicked off and will now develop goals for implementing into the integrated plan. If want to be involved, reach out to Zach.

- The HIV newsletter will go out today or tomorrow after final touches and we will circulate it to all PC members. It will include some of our new staff, EtHE programs, the PC Corner, HIV and other programs. - Prevention Committee meeting is today, June 1, 2022, at 4:00 pm.

- We finally received our full Part A grant award, and the team is now going through all contracts and allocations to revise the partial awards. There is a 5.2% increase from 2021, which is about \$208,000 more for our community. Another good part is we are switching to a three-year cycle now, so this 5.2% should serve as a baseline and the upcoming awards should remain this way for a couple years.

### Fiscal Report

- FY2021 Part A Grant: Final Expenditure split-79.40% Core- 20.60% Support, Expenses 95.50% -12 mo. (100% target) We allocated about 1.3 mil to our sub-recipients. We gave them options to set up partial budgets or wait for the full award and most preferred to wait for the full. Once we get that award distributed, we will get the full budget and can distribute accordingly. As of June 1, 2022, we served 6,180 clients although we have no invoices on the back end yet.

\*Comment: J. Patterson - Thanks and congrats on the additional amount. It's nice the sub-grantees can wait to create their budgets and good for small organizations who wouldn't have the ability to wait out.
 \*Response: Z. Levar - We don't tell anyone, we just give them the option. Most are in a position they can remain stable without a couple months invoices and this will all get revised and updated.
 \*Comment: C. Barnett – Any word on outside people qualifying for digital, online testing/training.
 \*Response: Z. Levar – The 4:00p Prevention meeting can provide that info.

# Progress Report from the PSRA Workgroup - C. Droster, J. Patterson

We looked at how data for spending and utilization changed over the three years, focusing on 2018 and 2019, as 2020 was Covid. We also looked at 5.2% increase and allocated the way we normally distribute with the award we got. Then we reviewed targeted category areas and how to allocate those.

J. Patterson – With final allocations, next year being the same, do we stay with 5% if award increases?

**Z. Levar** – This is two separate things, but it is still 5%.

**S. Harris** – How much more do we expect to get, not carryover, just regular grant or new money over what we got last year? Will HRSA give 52% and how should we project?

**Z. Levar** – We doubt that. We always write the ceiling amount and it's relatively stable.

C. Droster - We always ask for 5%, leave it up to HRSA, and we don't ask for less.

**S. Harris** - We stick with 5% and if we get more, that would be great.

J. Patterson - What were the flagged items?

**C. Droster** - We discussed four categories that had over 30% changes in ranking: Mental Health, Medical Transportation, Early Intervention, and Medical Case Management and these are the things we flagged. We also wanted to limit as few categories as possible for PSRA and keep it less complicated.

J. Patterson - We flagged ones across both categories for mental health and medical transportation.

C. Droster – Zach, is there anything else suggested?

**Z. Levar** - Just to test this pilot and see how this goes.

**C. Droster** - Thanks to the workgroup for all their efforts. This concludes the PSRA meeting group for the fiscal year and we will re-engage in February after the December vacation.
