POPULATION HEALTH WORKS TO OPERATIONALIZE EQUITY

At a recent Population Health (PH) service area meeting, staff engaged in a reflective exercise to determine how they could operationalize equity in their individual roles at CCBH. The strategies identified by the staff included greater awareness of one's privilege and how it impacts how you do your work, making space for and engaging marginalized communities at decision-making tables, and targeting program resources to those most in need.

PH Director, Martha Halko, stated that this exercise emerged from meeting assessments and evaluations indicating a need for more support to inform and advance equity initiatives in the service area.

The exercise is part of a larger effort in PH to unpack the activities and processes of each program to identify ways to further advance equity through service area processes, practices, and collaborative programs and initiatives. Additionally, PH staff have been encouraged to identify and incorporate strategies for advancing equity into their 2024 performance evaluation goals.

COUNTY HEALTH RANKINGS & ROADMAPS PROGRAM PROVIDES A TOOL TO ADVANCE HEALTH EQUITY

The Population Health Institute at the University of Wisconsin created the County Health Rankings & Roadmaps (CHR&R) to support health professional, community members, and other key stakeholders in advancing health equity. The CHR&R provides key stakeholders with the ability measure health outcomes in nearly every county in all 50 states, including here in Cuyahoga County.

Health Outcomes

Health outcomes represent how healthy a county is right now, in terms of length of life but quality of life as well.

Cuyahoga (CU) is ranked among the least healthy counties in Ohio (Lowest 0%-25%).

In addition to the various health data by county provided, the CHR&R also gives its users guidance, tools, and resources designed to accelerate community learning and action to advance health equity in their jurisdictions.
