INFLUENZA UPDATE

As of March 1, 2025, twenty-two people are reported to have died from flu-related illness in Cuyahoga County during the current flu season.

By comparison, twelve flu-related deaths were reported throughout the 2023-24 flu season.

Pediatric deaths

Both cases were affected by co-morbidities (other illnesses or conditions) and these issues contributed to their health outcomes.

Current activity

Flu activity level is currently rated as high. Nationwide, rates are the highest they have been since the 2009-10 season.

CDC estimates that there have been at least 33 million flu-related illnesses, 430,000 hospitalizations and 19,000 deaths during the current flu season.

Prevent flu-related illness
